

*"Campground" implies a place for camp meetings, a type of gathering that, even though illegal in some areas, served as a vehicle for slaves to commune and share their sorrows and hopes. These camp meetings were among the rare occasions during which enslaved people could actually experience feeling free for at least a little while through singing, playing instruments and sharing stories. Some of the lyrics most likely have a double meaning as well suggesting that the camp meeting they looked for was in Heaven, the place where they would truly be set free (from "Deep River" in *The New American School of String Playing*.)



Rev. Marci Glass: *Worship: Path to Reconciliation*

Last week, we looked at how worship leads us to freedom. We begin and end worship with music and praise. This week, we'll look at the acts of Confession and Passing the Peace. Because we have confidence in God's goodness, we are safe to acknowledge our own goodness, and our own failings. Our faith calls us to reconciliation, which we practice when we pass the peace with each other, but we must first be honest about who we are, how we interact with each other, and how we relate to God.

Calvary Friday Women's Group First & Third Fridays


Next Meetings: July 1 & 15 at 3pm

Nigel Poor and Earlonne Woods share their own stories of how they came to San Quentin, how they created their popular podcast amid extreme limitations, and what has kept them collaborating season after season.
